Thanks to all of you who made my two years as President easy on me. A special thanks to the Kimball's for holding all the BoD meetings at their house.



President Bob Williams called the meeting to order at 7:03PM

Guests: Shirley DePew, Teri Mourning and Shari Bolander (who joined after the meeting) and New Member Ray Heilman

October minutes were read and are now part of the record.

MAGNETIC SIGNS - Debbie Samovar reported that the signs have been ordered and will be in by the Christmas Party. The cost was \$3.81 each and she suggested that we sell them for \$5.00. Marilyn Rousher so motioned, Lea Williams 2nd, motion passed

NOMINATING COMMITTEE - Karen Kimball read the list of candidates:

Officers: President- Marilyn Rousher; Vice President- Angela Parson; Secretary-Debbie Samovar; Treasure-David Rousher. Board of Directors: Karen Kimball (2 yr term); Bob Funke (2 yr term), Jill Reineccius (1 yr remaining on term); Bill Clarke (1 yr remaining on term), President- Marilyn Rousher and Vice President- Angela Parson.

State BoD: Karen Kimball (2 yr term) and Marilyn Rousher (2 yr term) and Bill Clarke as Alternate.

Executive Direction: Bob Williams who will be available by phone for tie breakers or information.

Continuing appointments are Public Lands-Jerry Shriner; Education-Terry Sverdsten; BCHI Foundation Director-Joni Lueck. Lea Williams made a motion to cast a unanimous vote for the slate of officers and directors, Bill Clarke 2nd, motion passes.

CHRISTMAS PARTY - Angela Parson reported that there will be an auction this year (no gift exchange), a slide show, dinner is a buffet of Baron of Beef and Cordon Blue Chicken, and to bring items for the auction. Party is Dec 3rd at the Avondale Golf Club.

BCHI FINANCIAL STATUS - Bob Williams got a letter from the state regarding its financial health. Since doing the calendars, the state finally has more money than us.

MARIE CREEK PROJECT - Karen Kimball that she has been looking into what we can do fix the boggy area on the trail. She will be meeting with Andy Boggs in December and the work will be slated for 2013. Karen will write a grant for \$10,000 for timber and sand with a 50/50 match on labor. The grant is due by the end of January for the March RTP's. If we do this project 9 Mile will provide the stock and the sand bags. We would do this in late summer and would have to close the trail and work over a couple of weekends. We adopted this trail and Jim Kimball did the surveying for the switchbacks. It's for horses and hikers, not a bike trail. Before Karen proceeds with the grant she wants to know if the chapter will support this project and will we have the volunteers? If you can rake or shovel, you can help. Don't need to have a pack animal. An email will be sent out asking for help. Bill Clarke made a motion to continue with the grant, Jamie Smith 2nd, motion passed.

ATV'S AT FARAGUTT STATE PARK - There have been several e-mails regarding this. Contact Randal Butt with your comments and to get on the notification list for the January meeting. Robert Wuest suggested we contact David White, manager of all the parks and Tom Crimmins, who's on the state park's BoD, and ask if they'd come to the meeting and respond. Bob Williams cautioned us to make sure that we don't come across as "Us" against "Them". He mentioned he got an e-mail from Jeff Chapman regarding the Mt Spokane trails and that they want to put in a trail for mountain bikers away from the horses and hikers. It will be put into the newsletter. It was suggested that we let other users know about this, such as Cenex and Kootenai Mounted Posse. Bob asked Al Linscott, Bev Johnson, Julie Vulpine, Wendy Ward and Joni Lueck to be the committee on this and to keep us undated.

BICYCLE SIGNS - Karen Kimball reported that since the signs have been posted on the Canfield Trail the bikers have been more courteous and have been asking riders what they should.

FARWELL TO THE GENE & SHARON BRUCE - Bob Williams present Gene Bruce with a plaque and thanked him for all the work the two of them have done for the chapter over the years. There were a couple of short stories and a comment that if you want to go into the "Bob", the Bruce's were the people to go with.

USER SATISFACTION TRAILS SURVEY - Karen Kimball received an e-mail from Rod Parks regarding the survey. We'll have Jerry Shriner respond for the chapter and is open to all users. The e-mail will be forwarded to the membership.

LEAVE NO TRACE TRAINER - The State would like for every chapter to have a certified LNT trainer. Sherri Lionberger was ours. Rather than pay to have one of our members certified we can have Terry Steiner from Priest River come down and do an over nighter. Marilyn will follow up with Terry. Bob Williams said he knows a place in Chewelah. Bob said he was doing an outdoor survival training on Dec 10th if anyone wants to join him.

BCHI STATE BoD MEETING - Karen Kimball reported that the November meeting was done via Video Conferencing. Fees will be going up to \$50/hr/site (doubling) The conferencing is hard to understand and see who is speaking and not as much business is getting done, that she would like for our chapter to put forth a proposal that we go to just two meetings per year. Foundation Director Beth Wykle passed away and the state donated \$100 to the Beth Wykle Foundation. BCHA is talking about raising dues. Out of our PBCH dues, \$15 goes to BCHI who sends \$10 of that onto BCHA. This will be voted on in March. Raenette Dittier will be the new state secretary. It was voted to do calendars for 2013. On the Trail Classifications the TMO's are being

worked on and they must be reported on at the March BoD's meeting. The FS is very much aware that this must be done. Avery District has finished theirs and CDA should be done by end of winter. Rod Parks will be the state's new web master. Convention will be Saturday, March 24th at the CDA Inn/Best Western. Flyers are on the web site. BCHI is putting a resolution

to BCHA to allow BCHI to use chainsaws in wilderness areas as FS is understaffed. There are other states that already do.

LETTERS OF SUPPORT - Karen Kimball met with Andy Boggs who is going after grants for the Hells Canyon, Independence Creek and Snow Bird Trails, and he would like for us to write letters of support. Just a quick note to let you know what is going on with the new trail system here at Heyburn. So far the first loop of the trail which is between the Parkside Road where the trailhead parking lot will be located and Peedee Creek is pretty much roughed in. The second loop which is between Peedee Creek and the Bill Morris Road is roughed in all but two short sections. The third loop between the Bill Morris Road and Cottonwood Creek has been flagged but no work has been done on it. It will be the easiest of the three because much of it is open hill side. All of these will have to be gone over with a pole saw or on horse back to get the higher branches cleared. I will be starting again this spring as soon as the weather permits. The parking lot has been opened up and I will be starting work on it as well this spring. If any of your members want to get involved I will be glad to put them to work!










Gift Certificete

RELEASE AND WAIVER OF CLAIM

Effective Calendar Year 2012

NOTICE:

THIS DOCUMENT IS A LEGALLY BINDING CONTRACT LIMITING YOUR RIGHTS TO RECOVER FOR INJURY AND LOSS!

Please read back of application and sign as indicated.

Nothing in this agreement is intended to limit the effect of or replace the limitation of liability provided by Idaho's Equine Activities Immunity Act, Idaho Code § 6-1801 et. seq. This agreement is intended to extend greater protection to the entities named below. By signing this document you waive your rights to bring any legal claim to recover compensation or obtain any other remedy for injury or death to yourself, your spouse, your children, or others for the loss or damage to property, however caused, arising out of the negligent or other tortuous acts of the officers or agents listed below, now or at any time in the future, caused by their actions or failure to act, or otherwise. You also agree to protect, defend, and indemnify the officers or agents listed below against all claims for injuries you cause to others in connections with any of their activities.

- **1. Definitions.** Herein "PBCH" means Panhandle Back Country Horsemen, its officers, agents, activity coordinators, activity leaders; "BCHI" means Back Country Horsemen of Idaho Foundation, its chapters, officers, directors and members. "I" means the undersigned individual, all heirs, and the members of their family, including any minors whether or not accompanying the individual, and the personal representative, executors, and administrators of the individual.
- 2. Release and Waiver of All Claims and Covenant Not to Sue. In consideration of participation in the activities of PBCH and BCHI by me, by my spouse, children and other dependents, I irrevocably waive and release PBCH and BCHI and the owners of all facilities, equipment, and land used in PBCH and BCHI activities from, and WAIVE MY SUBSTANTIAL RIGHT TO ASSERT ANY CAUSE OF ACTION, CLAIM OR DEMANDS OF ANY NATURE WHATSOEVER, including by not limited to, any claim of negligence, which I may have or acquire in the future against PBCH and BCHI on account of personal injury, property damage, death, or accident of any kind, arising from my involvement in PBCH and BCHI activities, however the injury or damage is caused, including, but not limited to, the negligence of PBCH or BCHI. I contractually release PBCH and BCHI and agree to hold PBCH and BCHI harmless from any and all liability for any claims, demands, damages, actions, causes of action, or suits of any kind or nature whatsoever, which result or may result in the future from activities sponsored by PBCH or BCHI or coordinated by PBCH or BCHI members. This release applies to all PBCH and BCHI activities in the future in which I may participate. This release shall be effective and apply to all my heirs and the members of my family, including any minors, whether or not accompanying me, and my personal representative, executors, and administrators.
- **3.** Legal Action Limitation. If any of the entities listed above has to take legal action in relation to this Agreement, and the entity is successful in the action, the unsuccessful party shall pay to the entity, in addition to all sums that the unsuccessful party may be called on to pay, a reasonable sum for the entity's attorney's fees and court costs. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Idaho. Venue for any dispute or litigation arising out of this Agreement shall be in Kootenai County State District Court. Any modification of this Agreement or additional obligation assumed by either party in connection with this Agreement shall be binding only if in writing signed by each party or authorized representative of each party. There shall be no oral amendment or modification of this Agreement.
- **4. Acknowledgment of Risk.** I hereby acknowledge and agree that activities of PBCH and BCHI are frequently inherently dangerous and have a high degree of risk. I acknowledge that by execution hereof, I am waiving and releasing all claims against PBCH and BCHI for any injury whatsoever. I agree to participate as a common adventurer, being personally responsible for my own safety and not looking to any others to protect me from harm.
- **5. Statement of Capacity and Understanding.** I will not undertake any activity of PBCH or BCHI without becoming fully aware of the nature and extent of the risks inherent therein. By participation, I am voluntarily assuming the risks. I will not engage in the activities unless I am in good health and have no physical limitations, which could preclude my safe participation. I understand I am responsible for my own instruction in safety and providing for my own safety. I am of lawful age (18 years or older) and other wise legally competent to sign this agreement. I understand that the terms of this agreement are contractual and legally binding. By signing this agreement, I acknowledge that I have carefully read this agreement, and sign if of my own free will.
