PANHANDLE BACK COUNTRY HORSEMEN NOVEMBER 19, 2011 MINUTES

President Marilyn Rousher called the meeting to order at 7:00PM Guests: Daphne Kaiser, who joined.

December was the Christmas Party, we dispensed the business. November minutes were read and are now part of the record.

GUEST SPEAKER - Mike Walker of H & H Knife Sharpening gave a talk and demo on sharpening all types of blades. He demonstrated the HandiSharp saying lightly pass your blade over the stone at a 20° angle. If your out in the wilderness and in a tight spot, you can do an emergency sharpening using metal, ceramic or rocks. Blades stored in metal sheaths will rust, so rub them with vegetable oil before putting them away. Mike also showed us two knives that he sells. They both come in a quick release plastic sheaths, one that will hang on your neck and

ATV'S AT FARAGUTT STATE PARK - Wendy Ward reported that she received an e-mail from Mark Hildesheim stating they are not going to let ATV's on the trails. They can only be on Perimeter Rd which is on the west side of the highway. There will be a public meeting on Feb 15th at the Athol City Hall. Debbie Samovar will forward this e-mail to the membership. Ginger Swisher comment that it was strange that the fist message sent out on this was different than the last message sent out and that they were from two different heads.

CALENDARS - We have about 40 calendars left. Remember, the chapter pays \$800 on these, so we need to get them sold.

GRANTS - Karen Kimball has been working on a grant for Marie Creek that is due to Parks and Reds by the end of January. About ¼ mile up from the trail head there is a 1000 ft of muddy trail. We'll lay a woven cover over the trail and get about 175 four foot lengths of 8" x 8" lap joint timbers to boarder the trail and use rebar to join them. NineMile will come with 90 tons of sand and stay with their stock. The Sheriff's department will provide a work crew to fill the sand bags. We will also need to provide hay for the stock and not sure if we can get that included in the grant. Bob made a motion that we spend \$350 for hay if not covered by the grant, Bill Clarke 2nd, motion passed.

Karen is also working on a grant from Toyota. They give out twenty five \$5000 grants for this king of work. This is done on line and they need a letter from us on what we're planning. Jim Kimball made a motion to support this and to have a letter written, Jerry Shriner 2nd, motion passed. Karen will write the letter and have Marilyn Rousher sign it.

AUDIT - Jim Kimball said the committee looked over our books and reported that every thing is fine.

BUDGET - The 2012 budget was passed out and reviewed. Bob Williams made a motion to accept the budget, Angelo Bissell 2nd, motion passed.

CONVENTION PROPOSAL - Karen Kimball read a proposal to change the number of BoD meeting from three to two and that they be face to face meetings. They would be in March and late September or early October. As a proposal must come from a chapter, she asked for a motion to submit this, Lea Williams so moved, David Rousher 2nd, motion passed.

CONVENTION PREPARATIONS - Karen Kimball said the convention is Saturday, March 24th at the Best Western Inn and want this to be a really nice event. Additionally the State BoD meeting will be on Friday, March 23rd, here in city hall. Other members of the committee are Angela Parson, Lea Williams, Sandy Beamer, Joni Lueck and Debbie Samovar.

Expenses will be: \$66 for horseshoe table center pieces; \$120 for program printing; \$70 for photo contest ribbons and awards; \$160 for guest speaker dinners; \$300 for coffee mugs, of which we may have a sponsor; and possible other expenses and requested to spend \$716 if we didn't get a mug sponsor. Bob Williams made a motion to spend up to \$716, Bill Clarke 2nd, it was pointed out that we approved \$1,200 in the budget, so Bob rescinded his motion.

Jobs: Live Auction - Stan Smith will be our auctioneer, we'll need someone to record who won what and collect payment. Silent Auction will be handled by Joni Lueck, Sandy Beamer and Wendy Ward. Please bring auction items to the February meeting. Photo Contest will be headed by Debbie Samovar, need at least one other person to assist. Chapter Displays and Memoriam Displays will be headed by Bob Williams and he could use an assistant. Registration will be handled by Lea Williams, Jamie Smith and Cindi Richardson. Hospitality Room will be run by Angela Parsons, she should be able to beer and wine and will need help filling the tub with ice.

Vendors: We're letting vendors have a table for free and asking they donate a \$40 retail value item for the auction. Some of the vendors we're looking at are Hickman's, Wick's Metal Art, Rocking Seneca Saddle Packs, TNO Tack, artist Jeanine, Hatlies Books, Bonnie Shields, H&H Sharpening, Julie Bentley's Embroidery and Western Bling Jewelry.

State Board of Directors Meeting: This will be on Friday, March 23rd at the Dalton Gardens City Hall. Joyce Bissell will head up the kitchen crew. We need volunteers to help and we need side dishes such as soup, brownies, cookies and salads.

2012 PBCH EVENTS - Marilyn Rousher read a list of what we will be doing this year. These are MEMBERS only events. There were discussions about bring friends and/or family to the rides. It was suggested that we have people get a membership before the ride and then give it back to them afterwards and let them think about if they want to join. It was decided to make the Canfield and Heyburn Rides open to the public and have cookouts.

Bob Williams commented that when you pull shoes, if they're shiny, spray them will AquaNet hairspray. It prevents rusting.

Marie Creek Reconstruction Grants

I have filled out information on 2 grant applications for Marie Creek Reconstruction on the section of the trail about a quarter of a mile from the trail head where mud is created on the trail from spring runoff. The first grant can be up to \$5000 and is from the National Environmental Education Foundation with money coming from Toyota. The second grant is through Idaho State Park and Recreation which will cover all the costs of the materials.

I have work with the Forest Service to come up with the best materials to eliminate the mud from the trail. If we receive money for this project 8"x8" timbers will border both sides of the path, geo-textile non-woven fabric will be placed on the trail and then it will be covered with 3/4"minus crushed gravel. The timbers will have lap joints on the ends and rebar will be driven in to hold the timbers together and support them from moving on the hillside.

PBCH has agreed to do the work if either of these grants is approved for the cost of the materials. If our Chapter can haul in the timbers, geo-textile fabric and rebar I am hoping to get help from Nine Mile Ranger Station to haul the gravel with their stock and sand bags. By filling out a request to do this work it goes before a committee to be approved. I also have a commitment from the Sheriff's Department for some help through their work release program.

If either grants are approved the work won't start until the spring of 2013 because of the planning process and approval by NEPA with the Forest Service. We are going to need a lot of help with this project, if approved, so I'm hoping we can all pull together and improve this trail system.

I want to thank my husband for doing the calculations and fine tuning these grants. ~Karen Kimball


