PANHANDLE BACK COUNTRY HORSEMEN FEBRUARY 18, 2011 MINUTES

President Marilyn Rousher called the meeting to order at 7:01PM

Guests: Patrice & Mike Barnes of Equidance Meadows, David & Martie Fisher, Lou & Donna Kelleher, Don & Kim West and Robin Near. All of whom joined.

January minutes were read. Bob Williams made a motion to accept the minutes, Bill Clarke 2nd, motion passed.

GUEST SPEAKER - Ranger Don West of Heyburn State Park gave us an update on what's happening. There are 8-10 miles put in on the south side of Hwy 5, will have 15-18 miles when done and consist of 4 loops. The Boy Scouts helped out and roughed in some trail, still need to ride it to cut the higher stuff. There's no water on the south side. The trail head will be 1/2 mile up Parkside Rd, DOT will be putting in new signs on both sides of the road. We will pick a date in May to come lop the trail. He is currently working on grants to get gravel for the current parking area, plus there are now gates on the pens. There is a day use parking fee or you can get parking pass when you renew your vehicle registration. There are some new rules at the park, all dutch oven cooking needs to be tested and you must ask Ranger Don along on your rides.

GUEST SPEAKER - Donna & Lou Kelleher are the owners of Red Top Stables and Donna is the 2nd Vice President of the Idaho Horse Council. The council is the voice in the state on what's affecting horse groups, horse owners and the horse industry. They do a census on the horse population every five years. Currently they are worried about the lack of youth involvement and this years Expo in Nampa is Saluting Idaho's Youth. Membership for individuals/families is \$30, Associate is \$50 and clubs/groups are \$500. We are all members by extension as members of BCHI. There is an electronic newsletter you can get. Donna suggested that we join other horse groups, even if we don't attend any of these functions. It helps to show strong numbers. Grants come from the Idaho Horse Board which is funded from fees collected from brand inspections and whose members are appointed by the Governor from IHC recommendations.

ATV'S AT FARAGUTT STATE PARK - Robin Near reported that there was a small turn out, but we were taken seriously. There were 4-5 representatives from Boise and Dave Claycomb gave us his number. There will be NO ATV's on the trails and the training site has locked access gates. Farragut is one of the few parks that pays for itself. There are plans to expand the arena for barrel racing. The ATV group asked for a path to connect the two areas for ATV's and was denied. Boise is still taking comments regarding this issue until the 29th. Debbie Samovar will e-mail the comment form to everyone.

CALENDARS - We still have about 20 calendars left to sell. If they don't get sold, then the chapter picks up the bill. So get out there and get there and sell them.

GRANTS - Karen Kimball has submitted the grants and hasn't heard anything yet. Parks & Rec meet March 12th and approvals will come in June

TUNE-UP CLINIC - Will be April 28th at Red Top Stables. Services will be provided by Dr. Krista Porter. A fee schedule/sign up sheet was passed around and will be e-mailed to everyone and listed in the newsletter.

APRIL 21st MEETING - Our guest speaker will be Al Linscott, a former Airborne Ranger, will talk about survival techniques.

COWBOY BALL - Will be April 6th at the North Idaho Fairgrounds. A flyer will be e-mailed out and in the newsletter.

NORTH IDAHO COUNTY FAIR - We received a request from the Fair asking if we wanted to sponsor again and have a full page ad in their program at a cost of \$100. Bob Williams so motioned, David Rousher 2nd, motion passed.

CONVENTION UPDATE - Karen Kimball read a proposal from the North Idaho chapter that instead of the States sending 40 photocopies or CD's of their Annual Reports to the National BCHA meeting each year, that they just have them posted to the national web site. Debbie Samovar made a motion to accept this proposal, Stan Smith 2nd, motion passed.

On preparations, the cups are almost ready and Katie Bane is sponsoring them, so there will be no cost to the chapter. We have 3 halls for the convention, one for chapter and memorial displays and the photo contest, one for the business meeting and another for the banquet and live auction. Workers are request to wear their red t-shirts during the business session and then change into something nice for the evening. **WE NEED PEOPLE TO REGISTRAR!!**

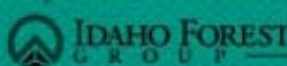

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

Notes: This flashy/fancy gelding had 1 yr of reining training when he came up with slight arthritis in his left hind fetlock. He is definitely sound for light riding (i.e. trail riding and light use) and it would be good for him. He can be trotted, loped and of course knows all the reining maneuvers there is just no guarantee he would hold up if he were put back into training or used for hard/repetitive riding. 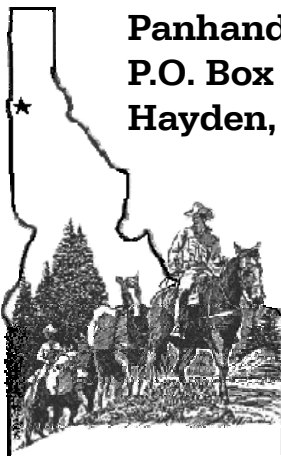
