List the file name for each photo.

- Photo contest theme is "Partnerships, Clear Trails" (photos should stress partnerships such as human-equine; organizations; equine-equine; equine-other animal)

 Categories are:
- Around the Camp Kids & Horses
- Four Seasons Critters
- Working the Trails The Countryside
- Chapters may enter up to five recent (last 24 MOS.) photos, not previously entered.
- Entries to be between 5x7 inches and 16x20 inches except for panoramic images.
- Entries must be single prints on photo-quality paper; no collage photos, no nudity.
- Photos may be either color or black and white; not matted or framed.
- On the back of each photo attach the following information; Photographer's Name, Address, Phone, Chapter Name and Category
- Submit photos not later than 12 noon Saturday, March 16, at the photo display area at the convention.
- Judging to be based upon the Photographic Society of America (PSA) judging standards:
- ü Technical quality: tonality, color balance, image sharpness, over or under exposure, blown out highlights or blocked out shadows,
- ü Impact or Subject Interest: story-telling; mood; unusual lighting; emotional response; the "WOW" factor.
- ü Composition: balanced center of interest; subject in focus; foreground to background spatial relationships; simplicity
- Ribbon awards for 1, 2^{na} and 3rd places shall be made in <u>each</u> category Single ribbon award shall be made for People's Choice of all entries.
