Minutes - August 21, 2013 - Meeting was called to order at 7:08 pm. Minutes were read from July 17th and were approved as read. We welcomed new member Melony Kelly. There was no guest speaker. In Stan's absence Karen Kimball read the treasurer's report.

Bernard Peak Ride

We had a small group of five who tackled a fairly technical 3-hour ride on Bernard. Thanks to Karen Kimball for leading our group up to the viewpoint and Bob Funke for leading us down. We went up and down somewhat steep and very rocky trails. The horses really had to use their brains to pick through the rocks and all did a tremendous job. The CDA Bowmen were practicing along the trail and had animal targets set up in the woods. That was my first time riding past someone shooting a bow. Bob was on the lookout for his magazine that was lost while scouting the trail earlier in the week but with no luck. We all arrived back at the trailers safely. Cindi Richardson and Lori Jenkins had sore knees from getting knocked by a couple trees, and Karen and Lori's horse got bee stings. Bees were bad so we were pretty lucky.

We parked along Hellroaring Rd and there is plenty of parking. We were on the Bernard Peak Trail that starts at the back gate of the Farragut State Park. The start of the trail is rocky and trees are close to trail (can be knee knockers). It is almost all in shade with lots of brush and evergreens. We rode approximately 2&1/2 hrs continuing past the view point and returned on same route. It can be a loop ride by going by Twete Road and then turning back toward the park.

Blue Creek Bay Area monthly trail ride

Ten people met at 10 a.m. at the boat launch area to begin a 2-hour fun ride east of Coeur d'Alene. The 6-mile ride wound through pine trees so we were mostly in the shade on the beautiful Sunday in August. We rode to several overlooks to view Lake Coeur d'Alene at Wolf Lodge Bay and Blue Creek Bay. Members riding were: Scott Bengfort, Ray Heilman, Lori Jenkins, Michelle LeVar, Bea Christopherson, new member Chris Shaller, Cindi and Matt Richardson, and Dee Dee Denison. Mike Bryarly showed up but did not ride. Joni Lueck was trail boss as Marilyn Rousher was not able to make it.

My friends and I used to ride this area when it was Wallace Forest trust land and before it came to be traded and managed by BLM. The chapter did work with the BLM crew in the past to put in signage and finish landscaping an area by the upper parking lot.

Some of the trail could use some shoring up where people have cut the trail and a general map with the trails identified could be drawn up as potential project ideas. Maybe some state education money could be queried to put together a nice map of the area in my opinion.

The three loops on this trail system wind around the mountain and are open and can be ridden two abreast in many places. Some up and down riding with few rocks make for a comfortable pace. The trails are well-marked and in good condition so it is easy to get around on the mountain. This makes for a nice group ride or family outing. It is close to town via Mullan Trail exit off I-90.

The parking was at the lower Blue Creek Bay boat launch off and also at the upper parking lot off Yellowstone Rd. There are several pull-outs on Yellowstone Road also but vehicles can get heavily hit with road dust this time of the year.
