

Many of my friends have been riding 4th of July Pass on a regular basis. It is off limits to motorized traffic, easy to get to off I-90 and lots of trailer parking. Much of the riding is in the big stands of Doug fir and cedar trees up there and the ground is not rocky or uneven. You do need to pack water for your animals.

Another popular place has been Anton Peak over in Washington, not far from Dr. Peters' vet practice. Logging roads and some steady climbing offer a good workout with good trailer parking.

Another place deep in the woods is off Twete Road up Bernard Peak. It has a great lookout over Lake Pend Oreille and Farragut Park. There are many trails in there for many hours of riding.

Blue Creek Rec. Area is close to town right off I-90. It is easy to get to and offers some climb to it and great views of Lake Coeur d'Alene. The Yellowstone Road can be quite dusty right now but the parking is good. Pack water for your animals. The trails are well-marked and wide and safe on this BLM managed land.

So with the many established horse trails around Coeur d'Alene, what are you waiting for? We live in a beautiful part of the country. You can check out the www.pbch.org web site and go to maps/directions to find these riding spots.

Have fun at the Kootenai County Fair coming up later this month. There are some other interesting horse-related events such as cow penning, cowboy dressage, horse packing and horse trail obstacles as well as gaming events to name a few in and around town.


