

### Featured ride for September - McKenzie Conservation Area in Washington

#### If you have not ridden here it is definitely worth your time. There is a big eagle's nest to look at by the water's edge.

McKenzie Conservation Area: Location: about 25 miles northeast of Spokane on NW side of upper Newman Lake. Directions: I90 east; take Argonne, Pines or Sullivan Exits north over freeway; right (east) on Trent toward Rathdrum, ID, for approx. 5 miles; left (north) on Starr Road for 4 miles; right at Y on Hauser Lake Rd for approx. ½ mile; left on Muzzy Rd 4.5 miles (Muzzy becomes West Newman Lake Rd). Conservation area is on left at top of hill. Description: upland forest, streams along Newman Lake Shoreline. 421 acres. Difficulty: moderate. Duration: 1-2 hours. No Discover Pass needed to park here.
