



No Minutes from last meeting.

Treasurer's report for June 2021 was provided by Bea Christopherson.

These items were approved for payment at this meeting. (John Galdi made the motion to pay the expenses and Betsy Walker second the motion, all approved).

Agenda

- 1. We had five members complete the First Aid/CPR on line portion of the certification and should be attending the hands on CPR course at the Fernan Ranger Station in CDA on Friday June 18th to complete their certification.
- 2. Obstacle Course event is going on June 19th It has been posted on Facebook, Craigslist, The Exchange and The Nickels Worth. Set up is Friday night at 5:00 pm and the event registration starts at 8 a.m. and the event runs 9-2. Jamie reviewed items still need and further coordination and assignment of duties.

Heat Exhaustion in Horses - Information gleaned from the Internet. Be familiar with your horse's vitals.

Symptoms: Sweating, increased temperature, increased heart rate, dropping to roll or throwing themselves on the ground, drawn up in the flank, muscles quivering, muscles tying up.

How to treat: Spray down with water, give banamine if tying up, give plenty of water and put in a cool place. Check temperature and respiration.

1. Normal temperatures for adults 99.5F to 100.5F and foals 100.5 to 101.5 F.

Heart Rate - Adults 24-36 beats per minute and foals 40-60 beats per minute.

Respiratory Rate - Adults 12-24 breaths per minute and foals 32-54 breaths per minute.

Mucuous Membranes should be pink and moist, with capillary refill rate of 1-2 seconds.

How to treat heat stroke in horses: Small amounts of water should be provided to rehydrate the horse. Electrolytes may also be given orally.
