Last work party of the year





A couple of years ago two PBCH teams cut about 37 trees that had fallen during a wind storm. About 6 fell across the long wooden bridge on the yellow trail, damaging it pretty badly .FONIT trail organization repaired the bridge this fall, cutting out the broken side rails and replacing several pieces of decking. Not being permitted to use motorized equipment to haul the debris away, they called Karen and asked that PBCH pack it out.

Karen and Jim Kimball bucked up the 4x4,2x6, and 4x6 into 18" pcs. Nov. 9th Karen, Jim and Arnie went in the park with saddle panniers, on Charlie and Reno, to haul out the wood. Jim found a parking area for his SUV and utility trailer about a mile down English Point Rd., which was about 200 yds from the debris pile near the bridge. Karen and Arnie parked at the main parking lot and walked the 2 horses in with the panniers in place.

Four trips to the parked trailer and we were done. Karen and Arnie put the panniers and gear in Jim's trailer, Jim drove back to the parking lot and Karen and Arnie rode back to meet Jim. Then Jim and Karen took the load to the county dumps.
